

# \$5 million for Alice Springs CBD Revitalisation

The Northern Territory Government has committed \$5 million to revitalise and upgrade the Alice Springs Central Business District (CBD).

These projects are now open for public comment so people can have their say. These projects were developed after broad community consultation at the Planning for the Future Forum. Four projects are proposed and work is expected to commence in 2010-11.

## Revitalisation of Todd Mall

The revitalisation of the Todd Mall includes new paving surfaces, lighting, street furniture and weather protection shelters to create a vibrant corridor that is attractive and inviting for existing residents, visitors and tourists.

Concept designs provide for new paving throughout the Mall, strategically positioned lighting to improve safety and enhance key features, new street furniture and weather protection shelters that capture warming winter sun and reflect harsh summer sun.

## Open Space in the Todd Mall

This will re-establish open space so people can experience the unique Alice Springs culture, heritage and identity. Proposed works include bordered desert gardens, aesthetic lighting, street furniture and weather protection shelters to create space that is sensitive to the local environment, facilitates and encourages public activities and attracts viewing audiences

Within the open space, facilities will be created for artworks displays, theatre, performances and markets.

## Leichhardt Terrace

The project will establish more market and open space on Leichhardt Terrace between Gregory and Wills Terraces. Indigenous history and culture will be a key feature along Leichhardt Terrace and the Todd River. Indigenous groups and leaders will be invited to make their contributions for the proposed changes.

## Green Streetscapes

This project will enhance the streets and encourage increased pedestrian traffic. More street furniture will be installed and more footpaths. Additional trees and plants will be included to provide shelter and shade.
